From Daycare to the Stage

FINN BO GEORGE. An expressive voice. The name of this young Swiss-British singer-songwriter is one to remember. He released his first song at the age of eleven. On November 22, 2025, the trained childcare specialist EFZ will present his debut album "From Outer Space" at the Conservatory Bern. An album that documents his musical journey and combines expressive vocals with piano and guitar.

"It's a personal work that documents my musical journey," says the likeable, 1.90 m tall musician FINN BO GEORGE about his first complete work. He welcomes his cousin, the talented <u>Drummer Tom Swirles</u> from Manchester (UK), as a special guest. "Working with Tom means a lot to me. As a drummer, he is, so to speak, the rhythmic soul of my music," says 19-year-old FINN BO GEORGE of his cousin, who is one year older and will complete his music studies at the University of Manchester (UK) next year.

Expressive vocals with piano and guitar

Swiss-British singer-songwriter FINN BO GEORGE combines expressive vocals with piano and guitar. After training at the Bern Conservatory of Music and taking singing lessons with renowned teachers (currently with English baritone Robin Adams in Bern), he has been devoting himself full-time to music since this year. Finn gained his first concert experience with performances at platforms for young talent such as the <u>Badesee-Festival</u>. The debut album was recorded in the last week of September at <u>Templestudio in Freiburg</u>, southern Baden. Finn and Tom are enthusiastic about the work and support they received in the recording studio. "We benefited enormously from the vast experience of the two studio owners, Oliver Noack and Frank Schmidt." Because Finn's friend on electric guitar was unable to take part in the recordings, a guitarist and bassist were called in at short notice. The guitarist, <u>Ralph Küker</u>, will also be performing at the concert on November 22, 2025.

The challenging path to independence as a musician

"Everyone tells me that going into the future as a self-employed musician is a courageous and also risky step," reflects FINN BO GEORGE from Thun, his full registered first name, on his path. But his training in music and his foundation as a certified childcare specialist give him confidence. He is currently completing his training as a youth and music leader. "The three-year apprenticeship as a certified childcare specialist was the best thing that could have happened to me," he said recently in a radio interview. The apprenticeship in the social sector covers topics in education, psychology, nutrition, care, and teamwork. FINN BO GEORGE will be able to draw on all of this again and again. Of course, he also brought music to "his" daycare center. "Music allowed me to connect with even the youngest children," says FINN BO GEORGE happily. With his music, he also wants to inspire a wider audience.

A varied musical life

During his three-year vocational training as a childcare specialist and the subsequent year of professional experience in Thun, FINN BO GEORGE used every spare minute for his music. He composes his own lyrics and music. Today, his daily routine as a musician includes voice training, practicing guitar and piano, creating content for social media, searching for concert and performance opportunities, collaborating with other musicians, and working in and with recording studios. "It's important to me that my lyrics have meaning and that my music remains authentic and acoustic," says Finn about his artistic work. It goes without saying that fundraising is also part of all these tasks. On November 22, 2025, the hall of the Bern Conservatory Music School will be filled with music lovers and will be a special musical experience for everyone. Despite support from Migros Culture Percentage, the city of Thun, and the municipalities of Bern and Thun, FINN BO GEORGE is dependent on the goodwill of music lovers. His journey into the future as a musician has only just begun.

Project description

"From Outer Space" is a concept album in the pop/singer-songwriter genre that tells the story of an extraterrestrial character who lands on Earth and collects human experiences.

Inspired by a childhood drawing, this character is artistically interpreted and presented visually and musically. The album comprises nine songs that combine various musical influences and will be released digitally as well as on CD and vinyl LP.
